



Virginia Stonebarger (1926-)

Virginia Stonebarger's extensive art education includes a BA from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio and an MS from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. She has also studied at such noted institutions as the Colorado Springs Fine Art Center, New York University and Hans Hofmann School, New York City. Virginia has been teaching art since 1956 and is currently an instructor with the Elderhostel program at the University of Arizona, Tucson. She also teaches private studio classes.

Virginia has had numerous solo shows throughout the United States and has been an award-winner in such prestigious shows as the Southern Arizona Watercolor Guild, National League of American Pen Women, Oconomowoc Festival of the Arts, Danforth Foundation Graduate Fellowship for Women and the Milwaukee Art Center.

Her work is included in over 200 public and private collections in the United States, France and Japan, including in Tucson, Estes Company and the National Bank of Tucson, and in Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Gas Company, Wisconsin Telephone Company, Caterpillar Tractor Company, Heritage Bank and the Marine Banks of Milwaukee.

Memberships include the Southern Arizona Watercolor Guild and the National League of American Pen Women. Virginia has also had the honor being listed in **Who's Who in American Art.**
